AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE A CERTAIN LANE IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY SHOWN AND DESIGNATED ON THE TAX MAP OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN AS "GORE, PLOT 17, BLOCK 397A" AND EXTENDING FROM BERGENWOOD AVENUE TO DURHAM AVENUE.

WHEREAS a gore strip exists between the northerly line of Map of Charles Hoffman and the southerly line of Map of Bergenwood Park, which said gore strip is variously indicated on former tax and other maps and referred to in various land titles as "Lane"; and

WHEREAS said gore strip or land has never been used as a public road and is not required as such since the complete construction by the township of paved streets and sewers serving all properties having boundaries on said "Gore Strip of Lane"; and

WHEREAS the Township has heretofore conveyed the aforementioned Plot 17 Block 397A to Walter Haase, which said owner has erected a building on a portion of said parcel, and

WHEREAS the references to said property as a "Lane or Gore" has resulted in a cloud on the title to said property;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: That a certain "Lane or Gore Strip" shown on the Tax Map of the Township dated October 1, 1954 as Plot 17 Block 397A lying between the northerly line of Map of Charles Hoffman, (Being in the northerly line of Block 3413, lots 61, 64A and 65 to 76 inclusive and the southerly line of Map of Bergenwood Park, (being in the southerly line of Block 413, lots 1, 28, 29, 56) and extending from Bergenwood Avenue and Durham Avenue, be and the same is hereby vacated as a public street.

Section 1. Section 2 of the ordinance of the Township of
North Bergen, New Jersey, heretofore adopted by this Board of Com-
missioners on December 2, 1959, and entitled: "An Ordinance to
create the office of Deputy Township Clerk, to fix the term and
compensation thereof, and prescribe the duties of such office", is
hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. The said official shall perform such duties
in the absence of the Township Clerk as the Township Clerk
shall by law be authorized or required to perform and in
the presence of the said Township Clerk shall assist the
said Township Clerk in the performance of such duties.
In the event of a vacancy in the office of Township Clerk,
the Deputy Township Clerk shall, until the appointment by
the Board of Commissioners of the Township of a new Town-
ship Clerk, perform all of the duties of Township Clerk and
such performance by such Deputy Township Clerk shall be
legal and binding upon the Township as if such duties were
performed by the Township Clerk."

Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday
from 8:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M.

Wednesdays, Sundays and the Legal Holidays of
New Year's Day; Washington's Birthday; Decoration
Day; Fourth of July; Labor Day; Columbus Day;
Thanksgiving Day; Christmas Day and Presidential
Election Day barber shops will close the entire
day regardless of the days on which they fall.

All barber shops shall display a sign not less
than 18 inches wide by 16 inches long, on which
shall be prominently stated the Township Ordinance
regulation for opening and closing hours and all
legal holidays; said sign to be displayed in such
manner that all persons frequenting said barber
shop shall have an unobstructed view of said
ordinance.

The window space of barber shops shall not be
obstructed by signs or other obstacles during
closing hours.

Section 2: This ordinance shall take effect after final
passage and publication as required by law.

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR IMPROVEMENT OF THE
SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM IN AND OF THE TOWNSHIP OF
NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY,
APPROPRIATING \$3,400,000 THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING
THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,400,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE
TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING SUCH APPROPRIATION.

* * * * *

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN
THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all
the members thereof affirmatively concurring) DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement to be made or acquired by The Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, New Jersey. For the said improvement or purpose stated in said Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$3,400,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor, and including the sum of \$1,515,000 (hereina called "Federal Funds") expected to be received by the Township, from the United States of America (or agencies thereof) as a grant in aid of financing said improvement or purpose.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvement or purpose and to meet the part of said \$3,400,000 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of said Federal Funds, negotiable bonds of the Township, each to be known as "Sanitary Sewer Bond", are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,885,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Township in a principal amount not exceeding \$1,885,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said law. To further temporarily finance said improvement or purpose and in anticipation of the issuance of bonds of the Township, and pending receipt of said Federal Funds, negotiable notes of the Township in a principal amount not exceeding \$1,515,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said law.

Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued is the improvement and enlargement of the sanitary sewer system of the Township by the construction and installation of a new force main extending from the Northern Sewage Treatment Plant at 91st Street westerly to Ballman's Creek, thence under the right-of-way of the New York Central and New York Susquehanna and Western Railroad to a point, thence e southerly and parallel to said New York Susquehanna and Western Railroad right-of-way to the Township-Jersey City boundary line, together with all necessary connections, valves, manholes, equipment, structures and appurtenances incidental thereto and acquisition of all lands

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purpose is \$3,400,000.

(c) The estimated cost of said purpose is \$3,400,000.

Section 4. The following matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The said purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is a property or improvement which the Township may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The period of usefulness of said purpose, within the limitations of said Local Bond Law and according to the reasonable life thereof, is forty (40) years.

(c) The supplemental debt statement required by said Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk and a complete executed duplicate original thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government in the Department of the Treasury of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in said Law is increased by this bond ordinance by \$3,400,000, and the issuance of the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance is permitted by the exception contained in subsection (c) of section 40A:2-7 of said Law to the debt limitations prescribed by said Law.

(d) The aggregate amount of not exceeding \$300,000 for items of expense permitted under section 40A:2-20 of said Law has been included in the foregoing estimated cost of said improvement or purpose.

(e) This bond ordinance authorizes obligations of the Township solely for a purpose described in paragraph (c) of section 40A:2-7 of said Law, and (1) the expenditure authorized by this bond ordinance and every part thereof is necessary to protect the public health and to prevent or suppress a present menace to the public health of sufficient gravity to justify the incurrence of debt in excess of statutory limitations and no less expensive method of preventing or suppressing such a menace exists, and the State Department of Health of the State of New Jersey has heretofore made a finding and Order to this effect, and (2) the principal amount of obligations authorized by this bond ordinance is not in excess of the amount determined by the Local Government Board in the Division of Local Government in the Department of the Treasury of the State of New Jersey to be necessary for such purpose.

Section 5. Federal Funds from time to time received by the

Section 6. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 7. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage, as prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

BOND ORDINANCE MAKING SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION OF
\$1,615,000 FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE SANITARY SEWER
SYSTEM IN AND OF THE TOWNSHIP HERETOFORE AUTHORIZED
TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN, IN
THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY, AND AUTHORIZING THE
ISSUANCE OF BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING
SUCH SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN, IN THE
COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members
thereof affirmatively concurring) DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance has heretofore been and is hereby authorized as a general improvement to be made or acquired by the Township of North Bergen, in the County of Hudson, New Jersey, by the Ordinance (hereinafter called the "Prior Ordinance") of the Township adopted March 25, 1964, entitled: "Bond Ordinance providing for improvement of the sanitary sewer system in and of the Township of North Bergen, in the County of Hudson, New Jersey, appropriating \$3,400,000 therefor, and authorizing the issuance of \$3,400,000 bonds or notes of the Township for financing such appropriation". The cost of said improvement, estimated in March, 1964 at \$3,400,000 is now estimated at \$5,015,000. By the Prior Ordinance there has been appropriated to payment of the cost of said improvement the sum of \$3,400,000, inclusive of the sum of \$1,515,000 (heretofore in the Prior Ordinance and herein called "Federal Funds") expected to be received by the Township from the United States of America (or agencies thereof) as a grant in aid of financing said improvement or purpose. It is now necessary for the Township to raise the additional sum of \$1,615,000 to meet the remainder of the said \$5,015,000 estimated cost of said improvement not provided by the appropriation therefor made by the Prior Ordinance.

Section 2. For the said improvement or purpose stated in Section 3 of this bond ordinance, and in addition to the sum of \$3,400,000 heretofore appropriated therefor by the Prior Ordinance, there is hereby appropriated the further sum of \$1,615,000. Said additional appropriation of \$1,615,000 shall be financed and met from the proceeds of negotiable bonds of the Township, each to be known as "Sanitary Sewer Bond", which are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,615,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Township in a principal amount not exceeding \$1,615,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvement authorized by the Prior Ordinance

of the Township Clerk and hereby approved.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purpose is \$5,015,000, inclusive of the \$3,400,000 principal amount of bonds or notes of the Township heretofore authorized to be issued for said purpose pursuant to the Prior Ordinance.

(c) The estimated costs of said purpose is \$5,015,000, inclusive of the sum of \$3,400,000 heretofore appropriated for said purpose by the Prior Ordinance.

Section 4. The following matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The said purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is an improvement or property which the Township may lawfully make or acquire as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The period of usefulness of said purpose, within the limitations of said Local Bond Law and according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is forty (40) years.

(c) The supplemental debt statement required by said Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk and a complete executed original thereof has been filed in the offices of the Director of the Division of Local Government in the Department of the Treasury of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in said Law is increased by this bond ordinance by \$1,615,000, and the issuance of the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance is permitted by the exception contained in subsection (c) of section 40A:2-7 of said Law to the debt limitations prescribed by said Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$450,000 for items of expense permitted under section 40A:2-20 of said Law has been included in the foregoing estimated cost of \$5,015,000 of said improvement or purpose.

(e) The Prior Ordinance and this bond ordinance authorize obligations of the Township solely for a purpose described in paragraph (c) of section 40A:2-7 of said Law, and (1) the expenditure authorized by the Prior Ordinance and this bond ordinance and every part thereof is necessary to protect the public health and to prevent or suppress a present menace to the public health of sufficient gravity to justify the incurrence of debt in excess of statutory limitations and no less expensive method of preventing or suppressing such a menace exists, and the State Department of Health of the State of New Jersey has heretofore made a finding and Order to this effect, and (2) the principal amount of obligations authorized by the Prior Ordinance and this bond ordinance is not in excess of the amount determined by the Local Government Board in the Division of Local Government in the Department of the Treasury of the State of New Jersey to be necessary for such purpose.

Section 5. Federal Funds from time to time received by the Township

be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 7. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

Recital

Pursuant to due action of the Board of Education of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, New Jersey, taken at and pursuant to its meetings duly held on November 14, 1963 and September 22, 1964, and due action of the Board of School Estimate of the Township, taken at and pursuant to its meetings duly held November 14, 1963 and September 22, 1964, the aggregate sum of \$1,950,000 has been estimated, fixed and determined as the amount of money necessary for the school improvement or purpose described in Section 1 of the ordinance set forth below, all as more fully appears by the certificate heretofore made by said Board of School Estimate and delivered to this Board of Commissioners.

Ordinance

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Title 18 of the Revised Statutes of the State of New Jersey, particularly Article 8 of Chapter 6 of said Title and any other laws applicable thereto, the sum of \$300,000 (in addition to the amount of \$1,650,000 heretofore appropriated therefor by ordinance adopted December 4, 1963, and entitled "Ordinance appropriating \$1,650,000 for a school improvement or purpose in the Township and authorizing the issuance of school bonds of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, New Jersey, to meet said appropriation") is hereby appropriated for the acquisition of lands by gift, grant, purchase or condemnation, located in the Township between 11th and 12th Streets and designated as Lots 9, 10, 11, 12, 17, 18, 19, 55, 56, 57, 58 and 59 in Block 22, as shown on the Tax Map of said Township, and the construction on said lands of a new schoolhouse, the furnishing and equipping of said schoolhouse and the improvement of the site thereof including the demolition of the existing schoolhouse thereon.

Section 2. The said sum so appropriated for the school improvement or purpose described in Section 1 of this ordinance.

Section 4. This Board of Commissioners being the governing body of the Township, hereby concurs in and consents to the said appropriation and in and to the issuance of said bonds.

Section 5. It is hereby determined that the period within which said bonds shall mature, being the period assigned by Section 18:6-66 of said Revised Statutes to the purpose for which said bonds are to be issued, is forty (40) years.

Section 6. The authorization of the \$300,000 bonds provided for by this ordinance uses up none of the borrowing margin of the Township previously available for other improvements.

Section 7. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds. Said bonds shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of said bonds and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect at the expiration of ten days from the date of its publication after final passage as provided by law.

(a) That the maintenance tests on all elevators shall hereafter be made effective within one year of the effective date of this ordinance.

Section 3: All fees and permits and penalties shall be in accordance with the current Building Code of the Township of North Bergen.

Section 4: All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to the inconsistent portions thereof.
