Section 1: That Section 6 of the ordinance entitled as above be amended by adding thereto as a preface to the ELECTRICAL FEE SCHEDULE the following provision:

No Electrical Work which shall come within the provision of this Code shall be performed without first obtaining a permit therefor from the Electrical Inspection Department in the Department of Public Works.

Industrial Bulldings:

When industrial buildings are vacated and use of electric service is discontinued pending re-occupancy, the electric utility company shall discontinue and seal off the electric service at the meter or disconnect service at the source whichever in the judgment of the company is appropriate. Before electric service is re-introduced, the electrical Utility Company shall direct the applicant for such service to apply for and obtain a Township permit prior to the re-energizing of service by the electric utility company. All metering must be removed in case of fire, flood, explosion, etc. unless the utility company finds such removal deterimental to the safety of the structure or occupants.

TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN HUDSON COUNTY, NEW JERSEY

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN ATHLETIC FIELD WITH RUNNING TRACK IN THE TOWNSHIP OF MORTH BERGER IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, MEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE \$490,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT AND TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION, AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Morth Bergen in the County of Mudson, as follows:

Section 1. The Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson shall construct an athletic field as a pice of public resort and recreation, on the plot of land leased to the Township by the Hudson County Park Commission for such purpose for a period of 99 years and consisting of:

All that certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the Township of North Bergen, County of Hudson and State of New Jersey, more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point in the southerly line of the Hudson Boulevard East Branch (now Kennedy Blvd. East) distant thereon five hundred sixtyfive and eighty-one hundredths (565.81) feet easterly from the intersection formed by said southerly line of Mudson Boulevard East Branch produced westerly with the easterly line of Bergenline Avenue as said boulevard and avenue are shown and designated on a certain map entitled "Map of North Rudson Park, in the Township of North Bergen, Hudson County, N.J. 1912; survey to monument and define boundary lines, made by Charles Hopper, Civil Engineer & Surveyor"; and running thence southerly South forty-one degrees fifty-nine minutes fifty seconds West (S41°59'50"W) two hundred (200) feet to a point, said point being the point or place of beginning of the tract herein being described: running thence (1) southerly and at right angles to said Hudson Blvd. East Branch, South forty-one degrees fifty-nine minutes fifty seconds West (S&1D59'50'W) five hundred twenty (520) feet to a point; thence (2) easterly and parallel to said southerly line of Mudson Blvd. East Branch, South forty-eight degrees zero minutes ten seconde East (S48°00'10"E) seven hundred fifty (750) feet to a point; thence (3) northerly and parallel to the first course,

Such athletic field shall include a one-quarter mile all weather running track, enclosed with fence, stell stands and fixed lighting towers, with facilities for a football field, walks, powed areas and other apportenances necessary for the use of such athletic field.

Section 2. The sum of \$490,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of constructing such athletic field. Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and from the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. The construction of such improvement shall be undertaken as a general improvement, and no part of the cost threof chall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the construction of such athletic field as described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"), is not a current expense of said Township, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Township, pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey, and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$490,000, and (4) \$25,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the astimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$465,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$70,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 60A:2-20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$25,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Township are now evailable to finance said purpose. The sum of \$25,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose bonds of said Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$465,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to said Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate which shall not exceed six per centum (6%) per amoun. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond enticipation notes of said Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$465,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to said Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuence of said bonds. WHEREAS, it is necessary that the operation of the proposed rail crossing will not be detrimental to the present and inture flow of traffic using 69th Street from Tonnelle Avenue to West Side Avenue; now, therefore

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Berger in the County of Hudson DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: Permission is hereby granted to the New York Central Railroad Company to construct two grade crossings over 69th Street along the center lines herein described:

(a) Westerly Crossing

"Beginning at a point in the easterly right of way the of the New York Central Railroad (being 66 feet easterly of the central line of said railroad and being also in the westerly right of way line of 69th Street) distant 7½ feet more or less southerly from the northerly line of 69th Street and going thence southwesterly to a point in the southerly line of 69th Street distant 78 feet more or less easterly from the centeline of said center line of New York Central right of way".

Section 1. That 90th Street, extending from the westerly line of Kennedy Boulevard to the easterly line of Bergenwood Avenue be, and the same is hereby vacated as a public street, and all public easements and public right to the same be, and the same are hereby surrendered and extinguished.

Section 2. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances which are in conflict with this ordinance or any part hereof, are hereby repealed as to the conflicting portions hereof.

AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE THAT PORTION OF 85TH STREET FROM THE WESTERLY TERMINUS OF 85TH STREET EASTERLY FOR A DISTANCE OF 469.35 FEET IN THE TOWNSHIP OF MOXTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON.

WHEREAS that portion of 88th Street extending from the westerly terminus of 88th Street easterly for a centerline distance of 469.35 feet is wholly within the lands of Emper Realty Corp. of 2110-85th Street, North Bergen, New Jersey, a trucking terminal embracing several large buildings and constituting a dead end street for the length of said portion; and

WHEREAS a severe traffic hazard is created by the drivers of trucks and other vehicles unfamiliar with the character of said street who, by reason thereof, are required to make a u-turn into the truck-ing terminal of the said Imper Realty Corp; and

WHEREAS it is in the public interest that the said street be vacated to prevent further accidents; and promote the development of area.

MOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: That 88th Street, extending from the westerly end of 88th Street 469.35 feet easterly to a point, be, and the same is hereby vacated as a public street.

Section 2: That as a condition of such vacation the said Imper Realty Corp. dedicate to the Township of North Bergen a plot of land as a cul-de-sac turning radius east of the vacated strip of land described in Section 1 hereof. Said curb radius to be 85° in diameter and surrounded by a 7.5° sidewalk area to be apportioned from Plot 30 in Block 458A as shown on the Tax Map of the Township of North Bergen and upon the further condition that the said Imper Realty Corp. construct and complete said improvement on or before May 1, 1968 in accordance with the Ordinances of the Township of North Bergen pertaining thereto including curb, road bed, asphalt and sidewalk, reserving to the Township of North Bergen the right to reconstruct, relocate, operate, repair and maintain a certain sewer lying within the above described vacation of 88th Street and extending northerly to 89th Street in an area to be selected and mutually satisfactory to the Township of North Bergen and Imper Realty Corp.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, REMOVAL, DEMOLITION, EQUIPMENT, USE OF OCCUPANCY, LOCATION AND MAINTENANCE OF BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES AND FIRE LIMITS" ADOPTED FEBRUARY 16,1966.

* * * * * * * * * * * * * * * * *

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: The National Building Code as adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson on February 16, 1966 is hereby amended by adding thereto paragraph 102.19.

102.19 No certificate of occupancy for a new structure shall be issued unless the street upon which it abuts has been constructed pursuant to the standards fixed and established by the applicable ordinance of the Township of North Bergen which shall include concrete curb, concrete sidewalk, and a minimum of a three course bituminous macadam road. The roadway to be no less than 40' right of way and the pavement to be no less than 24'; said road shall continue to an improved public road and if dead ended at one terminus, such terminus shall be provided with a cul-de-sac of approved diameter. This section shall not apply where the circumstances do not require the structure to be related to a public street. In the absence of an antecedent construction by the Township, the requirements herein must be assumed by the owner of the abutting property at his own cost and expense.

Section 2: Saving Clause

Nothing in this ordinance or in the Building Code heretofore adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding now pending in any court, or any rights acquired by liability incurred, nor any cause or causes of action accrued or existing, under any act or ordinance repealed hereby. Nor shall any right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this ordinance.

Section 3: Validity

The invalidity of any section or provision of this ordinance or of the Building Code heretofore adopted shall not invalidate other sections or provisions thereof.

Section 4: Inconsistent Ordinances Repealed.

Ordinances or parts thereof in force at the time that this ordinance shall take effect and inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

Section 5: This ordinance shall take effect after adoption and publication as required by law.
