AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE HEATING OF BUILDINGS RENTED FOR RESIDENTIAL PURPOSES AND FOR BUSINESS PURPOSES WHERE PEOPLE ARE EMPLOYED IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY" adopted February 1st, 1923.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, do ordain:

1. Section one (1) of an ordinances entitled as above, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:
Section 1: It shall be the duty of every person, firm or corporation who shall have contracted or undertaken, or shall be bound, to heat or to furnish heat for any building, or portion thereof occupied as a home or place of residence of one or more persons, or as a business establishment where one or more persons are employed, to heat or to furnish heat for occupied room in such building or portion thereof, so that a minimum temperature of 70° Fahrenheit may be maintained therein at all such times. Provided however, that the provisions of this section shall not be applied to buildings or portions thereof used and occupied for trades, businesses or occupations where high or low temperatures are essential and unavoidable.

For the purpose of this section wherever a building is heated by means of a furunavoidable.

For the purpose of this section wherever a building is heated by means of a furnace, boiler or other apparatus under control of the owner, agent or lessee, such owner, agent or lessee, in the absence of a contract or agreement to the contrary, shall be deemed to have contracted, undertaken or bound himself, herself or itself to furnish heat in accordance with the provisions of this section.

The term "at all such times" as used in this section, unless otherwise provided by a contract or agreement, shall include the time between the hours of 6 A.M. and 10 P.M. in a building or portion thereof occupied as a home or place of residence and during the usual working hours established and maintained in a building or portion thereof occupied as a business establishment on each day between September 21st in any year to May 15th in the succeeding year.

The term "contract" as used in this section shall be taken to mean and include the written, verbal or implied contract and the presence of heating outlets, radiators, risers, etc. in any hall or apartment or sub-division of a house shall be prima facie evidence of implied contract.

Section 2: Any person firm or corporation contracting to furnish heat as aforesaid, who shall be guilty of a violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, pay a fine or penalty of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or be imprisoned for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days, or both, such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Magistrate.

Section 3: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance or any part thereof are hereby repealed as to the conflicting portions thereof.

Section 4: That this ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE A PORTION OF TWENTY-NINTH STREET FORMERLY KNOWN AS GROVE STREET OR ATLAS STREET, RUNNING FROM GRAND AVENUE TO COLUMBIA AVENUE IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH KERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON AND STATE OF NEW JLRSEY.

WHEREAS a certain map entitled "Map of Homestead Station, North Bergen, Hudson County, New Jersey by Fouquet & Beyer, Surveyors, dated 1868" was duly filed in the Office of the Register of the County of Hudson and State of New Jersey as Map No. 497, and

WEREAS the said map provided for the creation of a certain street shown thereon as Grove Street or Atlas Street (now 29th Street) running from the esterly line of Grand Avenue to the easterly line of Columbia Avenue, and

WHEREAS the said street or land has never been used as a public street or highway, and

MHEREAS it is deemed advisable and in the best interests of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson that said strip of land be vacated at the request of Boad, Incorporated, one of the owners of the property immediately affected thereby, and

WHEREAS, Boad Incorporated shall at its own cost and expense install necessary storm and sanitary sewer lines in the road bed of said land to be vacated for the use and benefit of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson and which storm and sanitary sewer hines shall be extended ten (10) feet beyond the front and rear of a building to be erected thereon, which storm and sanitary sewer lines shall comply with the regulations of the Engineering Department of the said Township.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT UNDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson as follows:

- 1: That a certain street known and designated as Grove Street or Atlas Street, now Twenty-ninth Street, running from the westerly line of Grand Avenue to the easterly line of Columbia Avenue as shown on the map entitled "Map of Homestead Station, North Bergen, Hudson County, New Jersey, by Fouquet & Byyer, Surveyors, dated 1868" and known as Map No. 497 heretofore dedicated for use as a bublic street or highway is hereby vacated.
- 2: Excepting however and notwithstanding this vacation the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson does hereby reserve the right to enter upon said vacated street to lay down, maintain and connect into the said sewer lines as set forth in the recital and to do any and all things necessary to properly maintain the storm and sanitary sewer lines in and upon said vacated street.
- 3: That all ordinances which are in conflict with this ordinance or any part thereof are hereby repealed as to the conflicting portions.
- 4: That this ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published as required by law.
