AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A CODE REGULATING AND CONTROLLING THE LOCATION AND CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION AND OPERATION OF SWIMMING POOLS, THE ISSUANCE OF LICENSES TO LOCATE AND CONSTRUCT, ALTER OR OPERATE SWIMMING POOLS, AND DECLARING AND DEFINING CERTAIN SWIMMING POOLS AS NUISANCES AND FIXING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS.

* * * * *

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson do ordain:

Section 1. A Code regulating and controlling the location and construction, alteration and operation of swimming pools, the issuance of licenses to locate and construct, alter or operate swimming pools, and declaring and defining certain swimming pools as nuisances and fixing penalties for violations is hereby adopted. A copy of said Code is annexed hereto and made a part hereof without inclusion of the next thereof herein.

Section 2. The said Code established and adopted by this Ordinance is described and commonly known as the "Swimming Pool Code of New Jersey (1955)".

Section 3. Three copies of the said "Swimming Pool Code of New Jersey (1955)" have been placed on file in the office of the Township Clerk upon the introduction of this Ordinance and will remain on file in said office for the use and examination of the public.

Section 4. No person shall locate and construct, alter or operate a swimming pool until licenses therefore shall have been ~~issued~~^{issued} under authority of this Ordinance.

Section 5. The following fees and charges are herewith established:

(a) For the issuance or renewal of a license to operate a swimming pool \$250.00.

Section 6. Licenses issued for the operation of a swimming pool shall expire annually on the first day of May of each year and application for renewal thereof shall be submitted together with the required fee prior to the first day of May of each year.

Section 7. Licenses required by this Ordinance or Code may be denied or suspended by the Board of Commissioners, functioning as the Board of Health, for failure to comply with this Ordinance or Code.

The Board of Commissioners, functioning as the Board of Health, shall afford the person whose license to locate and construct, alter or operate has been denied or suspended an opportunity to be heard in public hearing by the Director of the Department to whom the Health Department has

however, that nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to repeal the Building Code or the Plumbing Code of the Township of North Bergen.

Section 10. In the event that any section, sentence or clause of this Ordinance or Code shall be declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction such declarations shall not in any manner prejudice the enforcement of the remaining provisions.

Section 11. This Ordinance and the Code herein established shall take effect when adopted and published as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND
SUPPLEMENT AN ORDINANCE
ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE
CONCERNING THE SALE AT RE-
TAIL OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS
IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH
BERGEN, IN THE COUNTY OF
HUDSON," ADOPTED DECEMBER
4, 1940.

The Board of Commissioners of the
Township of North Bergen in the
County of Hudson do ordain:
Section 1. That Section 9 of the
ordinance entitled as above shall be
amended so as to read as follows:

No licensee shall sell, serve, de-
liver or allow, permit or suffer the
sale, service or delivery of any
alcoholic beverage, or allow the con-
sumption of any alcoholic beverage
on licensed premises, on New Year's
Day when it is a weekday between
the hours of 6:00 A.M. and 7:00
A.M., on New Year's Day when it
is a Sunday between the hours of
6:00 A.M. and noon, on other
weekdays between the hours of 9:00
A.M. and 7:00 A.M., on other Sun-
days between the hours of 3:00
A.M. and noon.

During the hours sales of alcoholic
beverages are prohibited, there
shall be a clear view of the bar
or bars in the licensed premises,
from the public thoroughfare or
from an adjacent room to which
the public is freely admitted and
such bar or bars shall be covered
with cloth provided, however, that
these requirements shall not apply
to bona fide clubs, private dining
rooms in hotels and restaurants,
as defined in R.S. 33:1-1 (1).

During the hours sales of
alcoholic beverages are hereinabove
prohibited, the entire licensed
premises shall also be closed, but
this closing-of-premises requirement
shall not apply to restaurants as
defined in R.S. 33:1-1 (1), to bona
fide hotels, to clubs, or to other
establishments where the principal
business is other than the sale of
alcoholic beverages.

Section 2. There shall be added to
said ordinance as above entitled a
new section to be designated 10 (a),
which shall read as follows:

10-A. No licensee shall employ or
permit a female to tend bar on the
licensed premises, provided, how-

ever, that this regulation shall not
prohibit a female licensee from
tending bar in her licensed premises;
nor shall it prohibit the wife,
mother, daughter or sister of a
licensee from tending bar in his
licensed premises; nor shall it
prohibit a female holding forty-nine
or more percentum of the capital
stock of a corporate licensee from
tending bar in the corporation's li-
censed premises; nor shall it pro-
hibit the wife, mother, daughter or
sister of a person holding forty-
nine or more percentum of the
capital stock of a corporate li-
censee from tending bar in the
corporation's licensed premises.

Section 3. There shall be added
to said ordinance as above entitled
a new section to be designated
10 (b), which shall read as follows:

10-B. No plenary retail consump-
tion licensee shall employ any bar-
tender, waiter or other employee to
work in the licensed premises un-
less such bartender, waiter or other
employee shall first have submitted
to fingerprinting by the Depart-
ment of Public Safety of the Town-
ship of North Bergen, provided,
however, that such bartender,
waiter or other employee engaged
by the licensee when this or-
dinance becomes effective shall
submit to such fingerprinting within
thirty days after the effective date
of this ordinance.

Section 4. All ordinances and resolu-
tions and parts thereof inconsistent
with this ordinance are hereby re-
pealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take
effect when adopted and published
as required by law.

herewith are hereby repealed as to the inconsistent parts thereof.

Section 3. A certified copy of such ordinance shall be filed with  
the Division of Taxation in the Department of the Treasury and with the  
Hudson County Board of Taxation./

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect upon its final passage  
and publication, as required by law.
