CONTROL THE FIRE DEPARTMENT OF THE  
TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY  
OF HUDSON.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen  
in the County of Hudson do ordain:

Section 1: Members of the Fire Department of the Township  
of North Bergen are hereby prohibited from actively participating  
in politics other than to exercise their right of suffrage.

Active participation shall be deemed to include the following  
activities, to wit:

- (a) Membership in a county committee
- (b) Membership in a political club or political  
organization of any kind
- (c) Active participation in a political movement  
or campaign
- (d) The circulation, directly or indirectly, of a  
petition for any political movement, group or  
organization provided that this shall not pro-  
hibit a member of the Fire Department from cir-  
culating a petition for higher wages, shorter  
hours or other referenda permitted by statute  
for the purpose of self help

Section 2. Any member violating the restrictions ~~as~~be  
above set forth shall be subject to reprimand,  
loss of pay, suspension from duty, reduction  
in rank or dismissal according to the nature  
and aggravation of his offense.

Section 3. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent  
herewith are repealed as to the inconsistent portions thereof.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect when adopted  
and published, as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO SUPPLEMENT AN ORDINANCE  
ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE  
ENTITLED 'AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING AND ES-  
TABLISHING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE  
GOVERNMENT AND DISCIPLINE OF THE POLICE  
DEPARTMENT OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN  
IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON', ADOPTED AUGUST 21, 1957".

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The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the  
County of Hudson do ordain:

Section 1: That an ordinance entitled as above be supplemented  
so that subtitle "General Rules and Regulations" of a manual entitled  
"Manual of Rules and Regulations of the Police Department of the Township  
of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, New Jersey", adopted August 21,  
1957, is supplemented by adding thereto a section numbered 17A, and reading  
as follows:

17A (1) No police officer, as such police officer shall sell  
tickets of any kind from door to door, or to stores,  
business or industry, for whatever purpose.

(2) It shall be unlawful for any member of the Police Department  
to solicit funds or contributions of any kind in person or  
by any means whatsoever in payment for tickets, admissions,  
books, tokens, advertising, honorary or other membership  
or otherwise for any organization or association of police  
officers or to employ or retain in any manner, directly or  
indirectly, any person to solicit funds or contributions  
for and in behalf of such police officer or organization  
or association for a fee, commission or any basis of compen-  
sation whatever unless the organization or association con-  
sisting in whole or in part of any such police officers  
shall have first complied with the provisions of an act  
entitled:

"An Act regulating solicitation and application  
of funds for certain organizations or associations  
of law enforcement officers, providing penalties for  
violations thereof, amending section 2A:170-20, and  
supplementing chapter 170 of Title 2A, of the New  
Jersey Statutes", approved July 20th, 1954.

(3) No police officer, as such police officer, shall obtain or  
attempt to obtain Christmas gifts or gratuities of any kind  
from stores, business or industry for any purpose whatsoever  
without first reporting same to the Chief of Police.

Any member violating the restrictions above set forth shall  
be subject to punishment, including dismissal, imposed by  
Section 8A encompassing "Rules of Discipline".

AN ORDINANCE TO SUPPLEMENT AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED  
"A FURTHER ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE  
FIRE DEPARTMENT OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN  
THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, ADOPTED FEBRUARY 1, 1961.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson do ordain:

Section 1. No member of the Fire Department, as such member, shall sell tickets of any kind from door to door, or to stores, business or industry for whatever purpose.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any member of the Fire Department to solicit funds or contributions of any kind in person or by any means whatsoever in payment for tickets, admissions, books, tokens, advertising, honors or other membership or otherwise for any organization or association of firemen or to employ or retain in any manner, directly or indirectly, any person to solicit funds or contributions for and in behalf of such fireman or organization or association for a fee, commission or any basis of compensation whatever unless such organization shall have first filed with the Director of the Department of Public Safety a notice of intention which shall contain the following information and data:

- (a) The name and address of the organization or association;
- (b) The names and addresses of the officers of the organization or association;
- (c) The names and addresses of the officers or members of the organization or association who will be in charge of the solicitation or collection;
- (d) A Brief description of the solicitation or collection program proposed to be undertaken;
- (e) The purpose for which the funds or contributions to be solicited and collected will be used;
- (f) A statement that an audit will be made of the solicitations and collections by an independent auditor and that such audit will be available for public inspection at the office of the organization or association.

Each such notice of intention shall be duly subscribed and sworn to by at least 2 officers of the organization or association duly authorized therefor by resolution of the organization or association.

Section 3. No member of the Fire Department, as such member, shall obtain or attempt to obtain Christmas gifts or gratuities of any kind from stores, business or industry for any purpose whatsoever without first reporting same to the Chief of the Fire Department.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published, as required by law.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen  
in the County of Hudson DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: All members of the Fire Department of the Township of North Bergen shall devote all of their time to the public service in which they are employed and shall have no other business, calling or employment while such member of the Fire Department provided however, that they may be permitted to engage in such outside business, calling or employment within the territorial limits of the Township of North Bergen only, upon filing with the Director of the Department of Public Safety a statement of the nature of their work, the hours during which they are so occupied, the place where they are so occupied together with a telephone number or other appropriate information where they may be immediately summoned in case their services are required.

Section 2: Any member violating the restrictions above set forth shall be subject to reprimand, loss of pay, suspension from duty, reduction in rank or dismissal according to the nature and aggravation of his offense.

Section 3: All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed as to the inconsistent portions thereof.

Section 4: This ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published, as required by law.

## AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PLOWING OF SNOW ON TOWNSHIP STREETS AND REGULATING ITS

### TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN HUDSON COUNTY, NEW JERSEY

#### AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE THROWING OR DEPOSITING OF LITTER; ABANDONMENT OF SHOPPING CARTS; CONTROLLING THE DEPOSITING OF LITTER ON PUBLIC STREETS, ON ROAD- WAYS AND ON PRIVATE PREM- ISES AND PRESCRIBING PEN- ALTIES FOR THE VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

The Board of Commissioners of the  
Township of North Bergen in the  
County of Hudson, DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: This ordinance shall be  
known and may be cited as the  
"North Bergen Anti-Litter Or-  
dinance."

Section 2: Definitions. For the pur-  
poses of this Ordinance the following  
terms, phrases, words, and their  
derivatives shall have the meaning  
given herein. When not inconsistent  
with the context, words used in the  
present tense include the future,  
words used in the plural number  
include the singular number, and  
words used in the singular number  
include the plural number. The word  
"shall" is always mandatory and not  
merely directory.

- (1) "Township" is the Township of  
North Bergen in the County of  
Hudson.
- (2) "Garbage" is putrescible ani-  
mal and vegetable wastes re-  
sulting from the handling,  
preparation, cooking and con-  
sumption of food.
- (3) "Litter" is "garbage," "refuse,"  
and "rubbish" as defined here-  
in and all other waste ma-  
terial which, if thrown or de-  
posited as herein prohibited,  
tends to create a danger to  
public health, safety and wel-  
fare.
- (4) "Park" is a park, reservation,  
playground, beach, recreation  
center or any other public area  
in the Township of North Ber-  
gen, owned or used by the  
Township and devoted to ac-  
tive or passive recreation.
- (5) "Person" is any person, firm,  
partnership, association, corpo-  
ration, company or organiza-  
tion of any kind.
- (6) "Private Premises" is any  
dwelling, house, building or  
other structure designed or  
used either wholly or in part  
for private residential pur-  
poses, whether inhabited or  
temporarily or continuously un-  
inhabited or vacant and shall  
include any yard, grounds,  
walk, driveway, porch, steps,  
vestibule or mailbox belonging  
or appurtenant to such dwell-  
ing house, building or other  
structure.
- (7) "Public Place" is any and all  
streets, sidewalks, boulevards,  
alleys or other public ways and  
any and all public parks,  
squares, spaces, grounds and  
buildings.
- (8) "Refuse" is all putrescible and  
nonputrescible solid wastes (ex-  
cept body wastes), including  
garbage, rubbish, ashes, street  
cleaning, dead animals, aban-  
doned automobiles, furniture,  
refrigerators, appliances, build-  
ing material and solid market  
and industrial wastes.
- (9) "Rubbish" is nonputrescible  
solid wastes consisting of both

wood, glass, bedding, crockery  
and similar materials.

- (10) "Vehicle" is every device in,  
upon, or by which any person  
or property is or may be  
transported or drawn upon a  
highway.

Section 3: BURNING OF LITTER  
PROHIBITED: No person shall burn  
any litter in any open place, whether  
public or private, or in any outside  
receptacle, incinerator or outdoor fire-  
place.

Section 4: LITTER ON PUBLIC  
PROPERTY: No person shall throw  
or deposit litter in or upon any  
street, sidewalk or other public place  
within the Township except in public  
receptacles or in authorized private  
receptacles for collection. No person  
shall place any litter in public places  
for collection unless said litter is  
securely wrapped or deposited in  
properly covered private receptacles  
in such a manner as to prevent it  
being carried or deposited by the  
elements upon any streets, sidewalks,  
other private places or upon private  
property.

Section 5: LITTER THROWN BY  
PERSONS IN VEHICLES: No person  
while a driver or passenger in a  
vehicle shall throw or deposit litter  
upon any street or other public place  
within the Township or upon private  
property.

Section 6: MERCHANTS DUTY TO  
KEEP SIDEWALKS FREE OF LIT-  
TER: No person owning or occupy-  
ing a place of business shall sweep  
into or deposit in any gutter, street,  
sewer or other public place within  
the Township the accumulation of lit-  
ter from any building or lot or from  
any public or private sidewalk or  
driveway. Persons owning or occupy-  
ing places of business within the  
Township shall keep the sidewalk  
in front of their business premises  
free of litter.

Section 7: SWEEPING LITTER  
INTO ROADWAYS PROHIBITED:  
No person shall sweep into or de-  
posit in any gutter, street or other  
public place within the Township  
the accumulation of litter from any  
building or lot or from any public  
or private sidewalk or driveway.  
Persons owning or occupying prop-  
erty shall keep the sidewalk in front  
of their premises free of litter.

Section 8: TRUCK LOADS CAUS-  
ING LITTER: No person shall drive,  
load, or move any truck or other  
vehicle within the Township unless  
such vehicle is so constructed or  
loaded as to prevent any load, con-  
tents or litter from being blown or  
deposited upon any street, alley or  
other public place. Nor shall any  
person drive or move any vehicle or  
truck within the Township, the  
wheels or tires of which carry onto  
or deposit in any street, alley or  
other public place an excessive  
amount of mud, dirt, sticky sub-  
stances, litter or foreign matter of  
any kind.

Section 9: LITTER IN PARKS:  
No person shall throw or deposit  
litter in any park within the Town-  
ship except in public receptacles  
and in such a manner that the lit-  
ter will be prevented from being  
carried or deposited by the elements  
upon any part of the park or upon  
any street or other public place.  
Where public receptacles are not pro-  
vided, all such litter shall be carried  
away from the park by the person  
responsible for its presence and  
properly disposed of elsewhere as pro-

throw or deposit litter in any foun-  
tain, pond, lake, stream, lagoon,  
bay or any other body of water in  
a park or elsewhere within the  
Township.

Section 11: LITTER ON OCCUPIED  
PRIVATE PROPERTY: No person  
shall throw or deposit litter on any  
occupied private property within the  
Township, whether owned by such  
person or not, except that the owner  
or person in control of private prop-  
erty may maintain authorized pri-  
vate receptacles for collection in  
such a manner that litter will be  
prevented from being carried or de-  
posited by the elements upon any  
street, sidewalk or other public place  
or upon any private property.

Section 12: OWNER TO MAIN-  
TAIN PREMISES FREE OF LIT-  
TER: The owner or person in con-  
trol of any private property shall  
at all times maintain the premises  
free of litter. Provided, however,  
that this section shall not prohibit  
the storage of litter in authorized  
private receptacles for collection.

Section 13: LITTER ON VACANT  
LOTS: No person shall throw or de-  
posit litter on any open or vacant  
public or private property within the  
Township whether owned by such per-  
son or not.

Section 14: SHOPPING CARTS: No  
person shall leave or abandon any  
shopping cart upon the sidewalks,  
streets or roadways of the Town-  
ship of North Bergen.

Section 15: Any litter boxes or lit-  
ter baskets which are now pro-  
vided by the Township shall not be  
used by any person or persons for  
the depositing of garbage, rubbish or  
refuse therein.

Section 16: PENALTIES: Any per-  
son violating any of the provisions of  
this ordinance shall be subject to  
a fine not exceeding ONE HUNDRED  
DOLLARS (\$100.00) or to imprison-  
ment not exceeding ten days (10) or  
both such fine and imprisonment.  
Each day such violation is com-  
mitted or permitted to continue shall  
constitute a separate offense and  
shall be punishable as such here-  
under.

Section 17: SEPARABILITY: If any  
section, subsection, sentence, clause,  
phrase or portion of this ordinance  
is for any reason held invalid or  
unconstitutional by a court of  
competent jurisdiction, such portion  
shall be deemed a separate, distinct  
and independent provision and such  
holding shall not affect the validity  
of the remaining portion hereof.

Section 18: ORDINANCES RE-  
PEALED: All ordinances and parts  
of ordinances in conflict with the  
provisions of this ordinance are here-  
by repealed as to the conflicting  
parts thereof.

Section 19: This ordinance shall  
take effect when adopted and pub-  
lished as required by law.

# RECORD OF ORDINANCES

Passed and adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the

Township of North Bergen, in the County of Hudson, New Jersey

Section 7: During each snow storm and for such periods of time thereafter until the said snow is substantially removed from the streets and thoroughfares of the Township, all motor vehicles using the said streets and thoroughfares shall be equipped with standard snow tires or standard chains.

Section 8: The Department of Public Works, either through its Director or through any other representative thereof, shall have the right to prohibit parking for snow removal purposes in or along any designated streets or either side thereof during the aforementioned periods and signs prohibiting said parking shall be posted to announce the commencement of the said snow removal; in the event of such prohibition during the period aforesaid, no vehicle howsoever propelled, shall be allowed to stand or park, whether attended or not, in the designated areas, except for picking up or discharging passengers in the case of an autobus, or for picking up or delivering essential merchandise or commodities in the case of other vehicles.

Section 9: Whenever a vehicle is found parked or left standing in violation of the provisions of this ordinance, any representative of the Department of Public Works or any Police Officer of the Township of North Bergen, may remove or secure the removal of such vehicle to such garage or other place as may be designated by any representative of the Department of Public Works or any Police Officer of the Township of North Bergen for the impounding of such vehicles; and such vehicle shall be there retained and impounded until the person or persons owning said vehicle shall pay the cost of such removal together with a storage charge of Two Dollars (\$2.00) for each and every day the said vehicle is retained and impounded. Immediately after a vehicle has been so removed, either a representative of the Department of Public Works or a representative of the Department of Public Safety, shall give written notice thereof to the registered owner or owners by personal service or by mailing the said notice by registered mail addressed to the said owner or owners at his or their last known address or addresses.

Section 10: "Vehicle" as used herein is defined to mean every device in, upon or by which a person or property is or may be transported upon a highway, excepting a device moved by human power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.

Section 11: Any person, persons, firm, corporation or other legal entity failing to obey the provisions of this ordinance, or the orders issued by virtue hereof, shall be guilty of a violation of the ordinance and upon conviction thereof shall be liable to a fine not exceeding \$200.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding ninety days or both at the discretion of the magistrate before whom such conviction shall be heard.

Section 12: Separability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion hereof.

Section 13: Ordinances Repealed. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to the conflicting parts thereof.

Section 14: This ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO EXPRESSLY EXEMPT REAL PROPERTY OF CITIZENS AND RESIDENTS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, OF THE AGE OF 65 OR MORE YEARS HAVING AN INCOME NOT IN EXCESS OF \$5,000.00 PER YEAR, FROM TAXATION DUE AND PAYABLE IN 1961 AND THEREAFTER AS AUTHORIZED BY CHAPTER 9 OF THE LAWS OF 1961 OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (AN ACT CONCERNING EXEMPTIONS FROM TAXATION ON REAL PROPERTY OF CITIZENS AND RESIDENTS OF THIS STATE OF THE AGE OF 65 OR MORE YEARS HAVING AN INCOME NOT IN EXCESS OF \$5,000.00 PER YEAR, AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 4 OF TITLE 54 OF THE REVISED STATUTES).

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen, New Jersey:

WHEREAS as provided in Chapter 9 of the Laws of 1961 of the State of New Jersey, the governing body of the municipality is given the option and authority to order and direct that exemptions claimed by citizens and residents of the Township of North Bergen, sixty-five or more years, having an income not in excess of \$5,000.00 per year and allowed for the year 1961, shall operate to reduce the taxable valuations for 1961, and the financial position of the Township of North Bergen will not thereby be impaired:

Section 1. Every person who is a citizen and resident of the State of New Jersey for a period of three years immediately preceding October 1st of the pre-tax year, of the age of sixty-five (65) or more years, having an income not in excess of \$5,000.00 per annum and residing in a dwelling house owned by him which is a constituent part of his real property, shall be entitled, on proper claim being made and allowed therefor, to exemption from taxation on such real property to an assessed valuation not exceeding Eight Hundred (\$800.) Dollars in the aggregate, but no such exemption shall be in addition to any other exemption to which said person may be entitled.

Section 2. The financial position of the Township of North Bergen for the year 1961 will not be impaired by the exemption so claimed.

Section 3. The exemptions claimed and to be allowed for the year 1961 shall operate to reduce the taxable valuations of real property for the year 1961 in the Township of North Bergen.

Section 4. All applications for exemption under this ordinance for the tax year 1961 may be filed on or before July 1, 1961, and all applications for exemption in subsequent tax years may be filed on or before November first of the pretax year. Such applications shall be on forms prescribed by the Director, Division of Taxation in the Department of the Treasury of the State of New Jersey.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

NORTHERN AND CENTRAL SEWERAGE PLANTS OF THE

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring) DO ORDAIN as follows:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement to be made or acquired by the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, New Jersey. For the said improvement or purpose stated in said Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$180,000, including the sum of \$10,000 as the down payment for said improvement or purpose required by law and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a budget or budgets of the Township previously adopted.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvement or purpose and to meet the part of said \$180,000 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of the said down payment, negotiable bonds of the Township, each to be known as "Sewer Bond", are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$170,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law, constituting sections 40:1-1 to 40:1-38 of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Township in a principal amount not exceeding \$170,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Law. The maximum rate of interest which any of said obligations shall bear is six per centum (6%) per annum.

Section 3. The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued is the improvement of the sewerage system of the Township, by the reconstruction, alteration and improvement of the Northern Sewerage Treatment Plant, located in the Township on 91st Street westerly of Tonnelle Avenue and the Central Sewerage Treatment Plant, located in the Township on 43rd Street westerly of the right of way of the Susquehanna Railroad, including reconstruction alteration and improvement of the greenhouses or sludge-drying beds, settling tanks, pumping station and grit chambers, and the improvement of the sites thereof by fencing, painting and new lighting, together with all necessary connections, valves, manholes, equipment and structures incidental thereto, and all work and materials necessary therefor, and all in accordance with and as shown on plans and specifications therefor on file in the office of the Township Clerk and hereby approved.

Section 4. The following matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The said purpose described in Section 3 of this ordinance is not a current expense and is a property or improvement which the Township may

(e) The supplemental debt statement required by said Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk and a complete executed original thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in section 40:1-76 of said Law is increased by this ordinance by \$170,000, and the issuance of the said obligations authorized by this ordinance is permitted by the exception contained in subsection (d) of section 40:1-16 of said Law to the debt limitations prescribed by said Law.

(f) Not exceeding \$2,000 on account of the cost of issuance of said obligations as defined and authorized by section 40:1-55 of said Law, is and shall be charged as a part of the cost of said purpose to be financed by the issuance of said obligations.

Section 5. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this ordinance. RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING SUCH SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION.

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THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring) DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this ordinance, authorized as a general improvement to be made or acquired by The Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, New Jersey, has heretofore been authorized to be financed by the ordinance (hereinafter called the "Prior Ordinance") of the Township adopted July 2, 1958 entitled "Ordinance providing for improvement and enlargement of the sewerage system of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, New Jersey, appropriating \$4,150,000 therefor, and authorizing the issuance of \$3,900,000 bonds of the Township for financing such appropriation". The cost of said improvement estimated in July, 1958, at \$4,150,000, is now estimated at \$4,900,000. By the Prior Ordinance there has been appropriated to payment of the cost of said improvement the sum of \$4,150,000, inclusive of the sum of \$250,000 expected to be received by the Township, from the United States of America in cash, labor or materials, as a contribution in aid of financing said improvement or purpose. It is now necessary for the Township to raise the additional sum of \$750,000 to meet the remainder of the \$4,900,000 estimated cost of said improvement not provided by the said \$4,150,000 appropriation made by the Prior Ordinance.

Section 2. For the said improvement or purpose stated in Section 3 of this ordinance, and in addition to the sum of \$4,150,000 heretofore appropriated therefor by the Prior Ordinance, there is hereby appropriated the further sum of \$750,000. Said additional appropriation of \$750,000 shall be financed and met from the proceeds of negotiable bonds of the Township, which are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$750,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law, constituting sections 40:1-1 to 40:1-88 of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Township in a principal amount not exceeding \$750,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said law. The maximum rate of interest which any of said obligations shall bear is six per centum (6%) per annum.

Section 3. (a) The improvement referred to and approved in the Prior Ordinance, and the purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued, is the improvement and enlargement of the sewerage system of the Township by the construction and installation in and for the Township of the following sewage collection, treatment and disposal facilities: (A) New sewage treatment plant located on the westerly side of River Road approx-

westwardly to Newkirk Avenue and thence in Newkirk Avenue northwardly to 72nd Street, (16) in Dell Avenue from Union Turnpike northwardly for a distance of approximately 200 feet, and (17) in 29th Street from Tonnelle Avenue westwardly to the westerly side of the New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad; (N) Sewage regulating chambers, with necessary connections and related equipment, located (1) in 29th Street west of Tonnelle Avenue, (2) at or near the intersection of 5th Street and Grand Avenue, (3) in Liberty Avenue approximately 300 feet north of 10th Street, (4) at or near the intersection of 51st Street and Tonnelle Avenue, (5) in Tonnelle Avenue approximately 300 feet north of 10th Street, and (6) at or near the intersection of 91st Street and Tonnelle Avenue; (O) New and additional sewage pumps and related equipment at (1) the Hillcrest sewage pumping station located on Hillcrest Place east of Palisade Avenue and (2) the Tonnelle Avenue sewage pumping station located on the easterly side of Tonnelle Avenue north of 60th Street; and (P) Stormwater outlet facilities for the Northern Sewage Treatment Plant of the Township situate on the southerly side of 91st Street consisting of a sewage regulating chamber and related equipment and connections, outfall line extending northwardly across 91st Street to Bellmans Creek, and deepening, dredging and other improvement of Bellmans Creek downstream to a point approximately 350 feet southerly of Railroad Avenue; together, in each case, with all necessary connections, valves, manholes, equipment and structures incidental thereto and acquisition of all lands and rights-of-way necessary therefor, and all in accordance with and to the extent described in the Order of the State Department of Health of the State of New Jersey hereinafter mentioned and all as shown on and in accordance with the blueprints and specifications referred to in said Order and on file in the office of the Township Clerk and hereby approved.

Section 1: That portion of 90th Street between the easterly line of Grand Avenue and the westerly line of Columbia Avenue be and the same is hereby vacated.

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT PARKING  
TEMPORARILY FOR SNOW PLOWING, SNOW  
REMOVAL AND OTHER EMERGENCIES.

\* \* \* \* \*

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson do ordain:

Section 1. Whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that it covers the street or highway, no vehicle shall be parked on the following main traveled or major roadways or portions thereof:

Bergenline Avenue  
Broadway

The above parking prohibitions shall remain in effect after the snow has ceased until the streets have been plowed sufficiently and to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.

Section 2. Upon the declaration of an emergency, there shall be no parking upon streets or sections of streets where temporary "EMERGENCY NO PARKING" signs are displayed. The Chief of Police, or in his absence the ranking police officer, is authorized to declare an emergency and to direct the posting of said "EMERGENCY NO PARKING" signs when weather conditions, accidents, fires, or public celebrations dictate or require the avoidance of hazards or other conditions which interfere with the free flow of traffic. Notification that the "EMERGENCY NO PARKING" signs are being or will be posted shall be given to the operator or owner of any vehicle which has been parked prior to the posting of the signs.

Section 3. Any unoccupied vehicle parking or standing in violation of this ordinance shall be deemed a nuisance and a menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic and any peace officer may provide for the removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the reasonable costs of the removal and storage which may result from such removal, before regaining possession of the vehicle.

Section 4. The effectiveness of this ordinance is contingent on signs being erected as required by law.

Section 5. Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey Statute, every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this ordinance or any supplement thereto shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 15 days or both.
