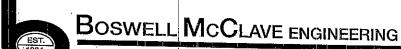

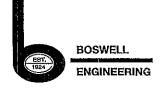
In October 2011 prices were solicited from a number of contractors to replace a number of steel lintels over various windows on the Police Ticketing Office. The contractor was also going to remove some cement stucco, cut brick joints and repoint where needed and brick up three windows on the first floor that were at that time covered with plywood. The intent of these repairs was to eliminate water leaking into the Ticketing Office and heat leaking out and impacting the staff in the interior of the building.

The last quote was received in December 2011. Work was authorized at that time. When the contractor commenced work, it was determined that the condition of the lintels that were scheduled to be replaced was considerably worse than originally anticipated. This led to an investigation of other lintels on the building. The ones that were scheduled to be replaced were damaged much deeper into the structure than originally anticipated. Other lintels that on the surface appeared to be in acceptable condition were found to be severely rotted on the building side of the lintel. In many cases, less than half of the steel remained intact at the window. The especially poor condition of the lintels was not obvious to the naked eye until the contractor commenced work on the lintels. It was found that

a portion of the existing masonry around the lintels had to be removed to reach a point where there was some sound steel left in front of which all the damaged lintels could be removed. This led to the more thorough inspection of all of the lintels over all of the windows on this part of the building. At that time it was determined that the originally anticipated quantity of work was considerably less than what was really required. The condition of these lintels as stated previously was such that the damage could not be seen without removing some of the masonry around the lintels. These additional lintels were given to the contractor for removal and replacement at the same unit price as was bid originally.

It was also determined that bricking up the original windows included in this work resulted in a significant improvement in the heat loss from the interior of the Ticketing Office. that basis, it was determined the other two (2) boarded up windows should be bricked up at this time. This work was added to the contract on the basis that the Township already had a unit price for the work and that the contractor was already on site. It was a reasonable assumption that any effort to obtain a new price would have resulted in an increased cost to the Township since the second contractor would have had to include mobilization costs in his bid where this contractor already had them in his bid and was working on site. The original work included the removal and replacement of 16 lintels above various windows. Eight (8) lintels were added to the work for a cost equal to 50% of the price received previously for the replacement of 16 lintels. The price for bricking up two more windows was increased at a proportion equal to the cost of a single window as previously quoted. An argument might be made that the two windows could have been done independently of the rest of the project. This office believes that it would have been a terrible waste of efficiency to solicit new prices for two (2) windows when, in fact, there was a contractor on site doing the windows who had basically given a unit price for same. The problem with the lintels was much more severe than originally anticipated and a large part of it was hidden under masonry and was not known until such time as the masonry was removed on some of the windows scheduled to be worked on. resulted in a further investigation in the windows that were

assumed to be in good condition and, in fact, were found to be in very poor condition.

This office believes these conditions justify the awarding of the additional work to this contractor. Prices were legitimately solicited before the work went out to bid. While the quantity of work changed, the unit items of work did not change. On that basis, the contractor received no unreasonable benefit from being awarded this extra work and the taxpayer received no negative benefit from allowing this additional work to proceed.

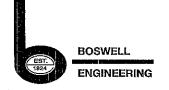

CALENDAR YEAR 2012 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

REFUNDING BOND ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN, IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY, PROVIDING FOR THE ADVANCE REFUNDING OF ALL OR A PORTION OF GENERAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS, SERIES 2003, APPROPRIATING \$3,120,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE BY THE TOWNSHIP OF REFUNDING BONDS IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT EXCEEDING \$3,120,000 FOR FINANCING THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN, IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Township of North Bergen, in the County of Hudson, New Jersey (the "Township") is hereby authorized to advance refund all or a portion of the \$3,200,000 outstanding principal amount of its General Improvement Bonds, Series 2003 (the "Bonds"), originally issued in the principal amount of \$6,878,000, dated April 1, 2003, which amount matures on April 1 in the years 2014 through 2021, inclusive (the "Refunded Bonds") and which are subject to redemption on or after April 1, 2013 at the option of the Township at a redemption price of 100% of the principal amount of the Refunded Bonds to be redeemed.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the purpose described in Section 1 hereof and the costs of issuance associated therewith, negotiable refunding bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in one or more series in the aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$3,120,000 (the "Refunding Bonds") pursuant to the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey.

Section 3. An aggregate amount not exceeding \$100,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-51(b) has been included in the aggregate principal amount of Refunding Bonds authorized herein.

Section 4. The Township desires to provide for all or a portion of the principal amount of the Refunded Bonds outstanding and the interest and redemption premium, if any, thereon in order to provide for savings in debt service as a result of lower interest rates in the bond markets.

Section 5. The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law

has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed

duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local

BUDGET MESSAGE

To the Citizens of the Township of North Bergen:

The Board of Commissioners and I hereby present the CY 2012 Municipal budget, which covers the period January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012.

This year's budget successfully maintains municipal services at quality levels that our residents expect.

Although faced with increased costs, our Administration continues to operate in a fiscally prudent manner; utilizing firm amounts of surplus, aggressively paying down debt and facilitating a stable tax ratable base, have allowed for the continued provision of essential services within our community.

As we strive to continue to enhance the quality of life of our residents, highlights of this year's budget include: the renovation of a building that will house the new Municipal Court; the continued implementation of a Township wide CCTV system; improved snow removal and street cleaning capabilities; and additional paving of streets and roads.

In summary, I am once again pleased to present a budget that demonstrates prudent spending and provides quality services to our residents. Our Administration's efforts to accomplish more for our Township with less resources are clearly reflected here.

The following represents various information that is required, by the State of New Jersey to be stated in the budget message:

Health Care Coverage

Municipal Library Tax Law

Public Law 2011, c. 38 was enacted on March 21, 2011. The law provides for a dedicated line item on future property tax bills to fund Municipal Free Public Libraries. This law does not result in any increased taxes, but changes the way the minimum library appropriation is displayed to the public.

As a result, the municipal tax levy for the Calendar Year 2012 budget of \$57,000,000 has been reduced by the minimum public library tax of \$1,654,348.64, and is now \$55,345,651. Please note that this change does not result in a property tax increase, and is being made to help you better understand the costs of library services.
